Supply List Painting with Watercolor

This is a basic supply list to get you started

Watercolor

Paint

Red – a red, red such as Winsor Yellow – a lemon yellow, such as auerolin Blue – a warm blue, such as Antwerp A cool blue, such as ultramarine Brown – raw umber or sepia *there is no white paint in pure transparent watercolor, white and light is made by the water and white paper

Tubes are best, size and brands vary. Around .27 fl oz is a good size. Tube sets Are O.K and economical for beginning. (you will not use the white or black) Winsor Newton Cotman, and Golden are the best. Grumbacher and Holbein are other brands.

Paper

Watercolor pad med to heavy weight 90 - 140 lb. approximately 12 X 18 (arches)

Palette White plastic with a lid and area in the center For mixing colors

Brushes Soft hair – synthetic sable like 1 inch, ½ inch flat 2 rounds

Misc. Supplies Water container – large Paper towels & rag/towel Soft lead pencil & eraser

Optional supplies Blow dryer Tracing paper or drafting vellum 12 X 18 Salt shaker Small spritzing water bottle
