

Gavin will be painting in oil. Students are free to work in the medium of their choosing. If they have painting experience and art supplies they are comfortable with, they are free to use them. They will need basic drawing supplies - a sketchbook and pencil or charcoal, a kneaded eraser and a pad of newsprint, any size.

Gavin's suggested supply list for oil painters: Plaza Artist's Materials (store) and Jack Richeson Art Supplies (manufacturer) have assembled a Cityscape Workshop Kit which includes all the paints and brushes that I suggest using. You don't need to use these but you certainly may. Here is the link:

Gavin uses these materials because they make painting much easier - especially the brushes. They materials are available individually as well as in a pre-assembled kit.

Canvas: If you're going to paint in oil or acrylic, you'll need a canvas. Gavin doesn't use store-bought canvases, although students may want to because they're easier to prep. See the attachment "Canvas Notes for Students."

Students will need one canvas/panel for their final painting and two, which can be smaller, for studies.

Photos: Students will work from photos they bring to class. They can be printed or on a screen/device.
